Keynote Speaker Rev. Terry Atwater



Rev. Terry V. Atwater is a native of Evansville, Indiana. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering and Master of Business Administration from the University of Evansville in 1968 and 1972. Atwater was also a member of the Evansville Aces basketball team that won the NCAA Championship in 1965. Atwater worked at Bristol-Myers until he moved to the Waukegan area to a position at

Abbott Laboratories in North Chicago. In 1979, he started his own business, Midwest Engineering & Technical Services. After moving to the Waukegan area, he immediately became active in the Church of Christ and started preaching in 1975 and has been the senior minister for 40 years at North Shore Church of Christ. Atwater and his wife, Sandra, were awarded the Visionary Award Most Influential African American Award in Lake County, Illinois, in 2010, and in 2015 he was honored by the city of Waukegan, Illinois, with an Honorary Street sign, "Brother Terry Atwater Boulevard" on the corner of Steele and Julian Street.
