Students are instructed on the effective use of educational technology during the EDUC 265, Introduction to Ed Tech, course. Students in internships (junior block internship and all special education) work with teachers who are using educational technology in their classrooms. This includes web-based commercial assessment products (NWEA, Google Workspace products, including Google Classroom, Google Docs, and Google Sheets, etc.) using hand-held devices and Promethean Boards along with other Computer Science technology such as 3D printers, Ozobots, Dobots, Sphero Indies and other robotic equipment. Students are also required to develop an educational technology portfolio during their internship courses, EDUC 363, 443, 418, and 419. During the student teaching semester, students also complete the edTPA portfolio, which is electronically filed.
