

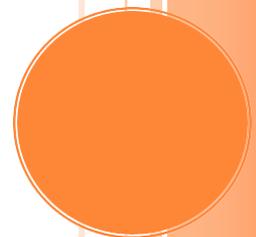

## *Diversity Funding Proposal for Students*

The mission of the (CDEI) supports the mission of the University of Evansville by promoting and guiding purposeful student engagement, fostering authentic community, and providing opportunities for student growth and leadership development. The CDEI aspires to create an inclusive environment that celebrates diversity and enhances the students' ability to become global citizens. Within this framework, the CDEI is accepting program proposals from registered student organizations that support the institution's diversity initiatives.

Success in diversity programming and events is contingent on aligning values with actions. Diversity and inclusion are about building strong, trusting relationships with people as they are—organizationally and personally. The University of Evansville believes that diversity is a critically important factor in the delivery of its mission, both from a global perspective and learning perspective, but also as a fundamental principle necessary to UE's commitment to diversity and inclusion in all aspects and for all students at the university.

### **Types of Programs or Events**

The CDEI expects programs that are supported by this funding to reflect the following values:

- **Personal and intellectual growth:** programs or events that challenge students to think critically about concepts that challenge their assumptions regarding social justice issues.
- **Community:** programs or events that build stronger, more inclusive communities for all students and enhance the opportunity for collaboration among different groups across campus.
- **Learning:** programs or events that teach students about social justice issues, how to work with others, about our own biases, assumptions, and other areas of growth.
- **Diversity:** programs or events that help students to challenge others to explore contemporary issues related to systems of difference and inequality and help to empower them to be agents of change.
- **Civility and integrity:** programs and events that support students in living their values and purpose through action and standards.

## Diversity Funding Proposal for Students

### Eligibility for Funding:

- Programs or events must reflect personal and intellectual growth, community, learning, diversity, civility, and integrity.

- Any outside food must be approved by Chartwell Food Services
- On-campus events must be free and open to all University of Evansville students, faculty, and staff

### Description of Funds Available:

- Each student organization is eligible to request fund amounts in one of the following categories for each submitted proposal
  1. Diverse Speakers/Performers—up to \$1000.00
  2. Diverse Documentaries or movies—up to \$375.00
  3. Diversity Conference/Workshop Registration and Attendance Cost—up to \$500.00
  4. Diversity Training (hosting or online webinars)—up to \$250.00
  5. Transportation to Events (rentals or buses)—up to \$500.00
  6. Chartwell food services/ outside food—up to \$200.00
  7. Program Supplies/Miscellaneous—up to \$100.00
- Requests for funding forms must be submitted at least 3 weeks before the event.
- Items NOT funded
  1. Alcohol or tobacco products
  2. Insurance, member fees or dues
  3. Honoraria for University of Evansville students, faculty, staff or administrators
  4. Gift certificates

### Promotional Materials:

All promotional materials must include the wording *funded by the UE Student Government Association and sponsored by the Center for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion*. All promotional materials must be approved and stamped by the Office of Student Engagement. Visit <https://www.evansville.edu/studentengagement/organizations.cfm> for more information.

### After Program or Event:

- All itemized receipts must be turned in within 5 business days after the event to the Office of Diversity Initiatives
- Assessment form needs to be completed 5 business days after the program or event. Upon approval, the assessment will be emailed to the primary contact.
